What is UCAS?

UCAS (Universities and Colleges Admissions Service) is an independent charity providing information, advice and admissions services. UCAS helps people discover what their next step might be.

UCAS does:

- provide information, advice, and support
- process applications
- complete fraud and verification checks
- take part in education sector engagement

UCAS doesn't:

- make decisions or offers
- set entry requirements
- advise on finance
- advise on immigration or visas for individuals

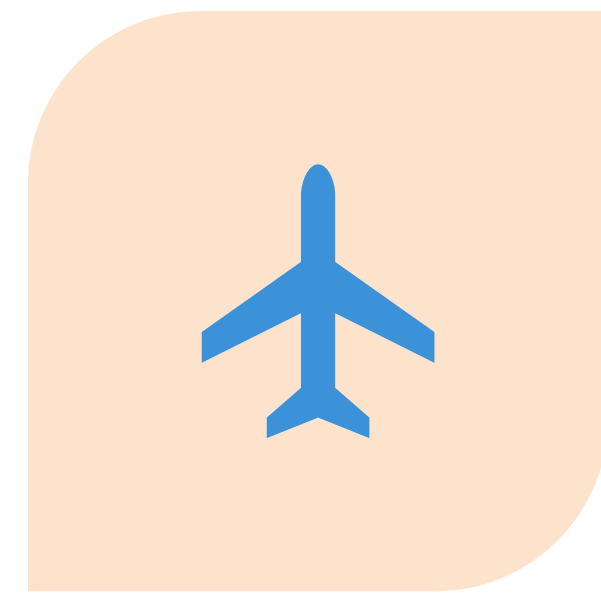

DISCOVER PATHWAYS

- **Certificate of Higher Education (CertHE) and Diploma of Higher Education (DipHE):** first and second year of a degree course.
- **Higher National Certificate (HNC) and Higher National Diploma (HND):** HNC is a one-year industry specific course, and the HND is a two-year industry specific course. Higher technical qualifications (HTQs) in England are an example of these.
- **Foundation degree:** flexible vocational qualification, combining both academic study and workplace learning. It usually takes two years to complete.
- **Bachelor's or undergraduate degree:** a three to four-year course which can also be available as a part-time option, allowing you to study and work.
- **Apprenticeships:** typically take between 8 months to 6 years to complete depending on their level. Apprenticeships are offered for levels 2-7 in N.I. and England, levels 2-6 in Wales, and SCQF levels 4-11 in Scotland. All nations offer degree level apprenticeships.

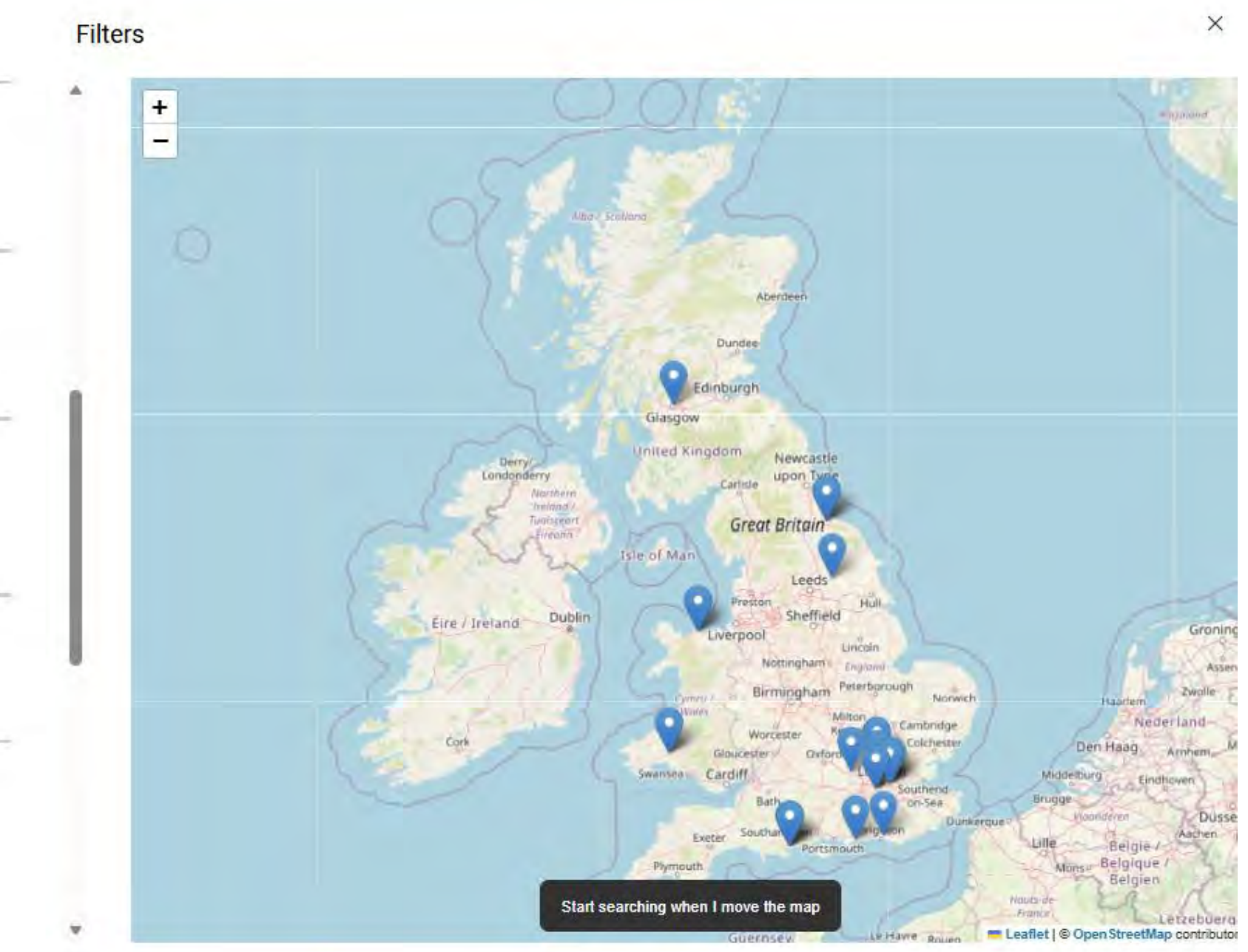

- not downloaded or plagiarised
- not complicated
- not deliberately made 'intellectual' - simple & clear doesn't mean 'simplistic', it just means it's easy to read & easier for it to make an impact.

- Should show depth rather than breadth

HOW DOES IT **WORK?**

WHO ARE THEY FOR?

- Anyone 16 and over
- Anyone not in full time education*
- Apprenticeships in Scotland, Wales or England require you to be living in the same country as the apprenticeship
- Apprenticeships in Northern Ireland require you to:
 - be employed or be about to take up paid employment in Northern Ireland
 - be working a minimum of 21 hours per week on a permanent contract

* a foundation apprenticeship in Scotland is typically taken alongside Scottish Higher and National 5s

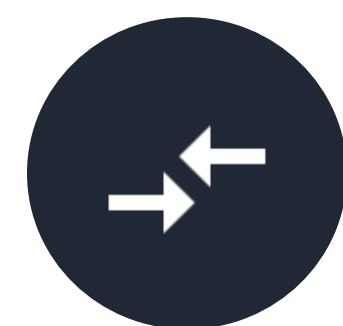

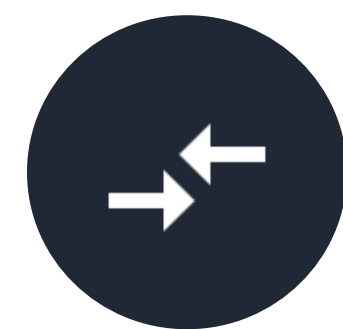

WHEN CAN I APPLY?

- Advertised throughout the year; with no single application deadline.
- Larger organisations with multiple application processes may recruit earlier than smaller local organisations.
- Higher apprenticeships with a Sep/Oct start tend to recruit in the previous academic year.

HOW DO I APPLY?

- Applications are made directly through the company or training provider.
- There is no limit on the number of applications you can make.
- The application process might vary across vacancies, you could be asked for:
 - CV and Covering Letter
 - Application Form
 - In App/Website application
 - Phone/video/in person interviews
- You can apply for universities and apprenticeships at the same time!

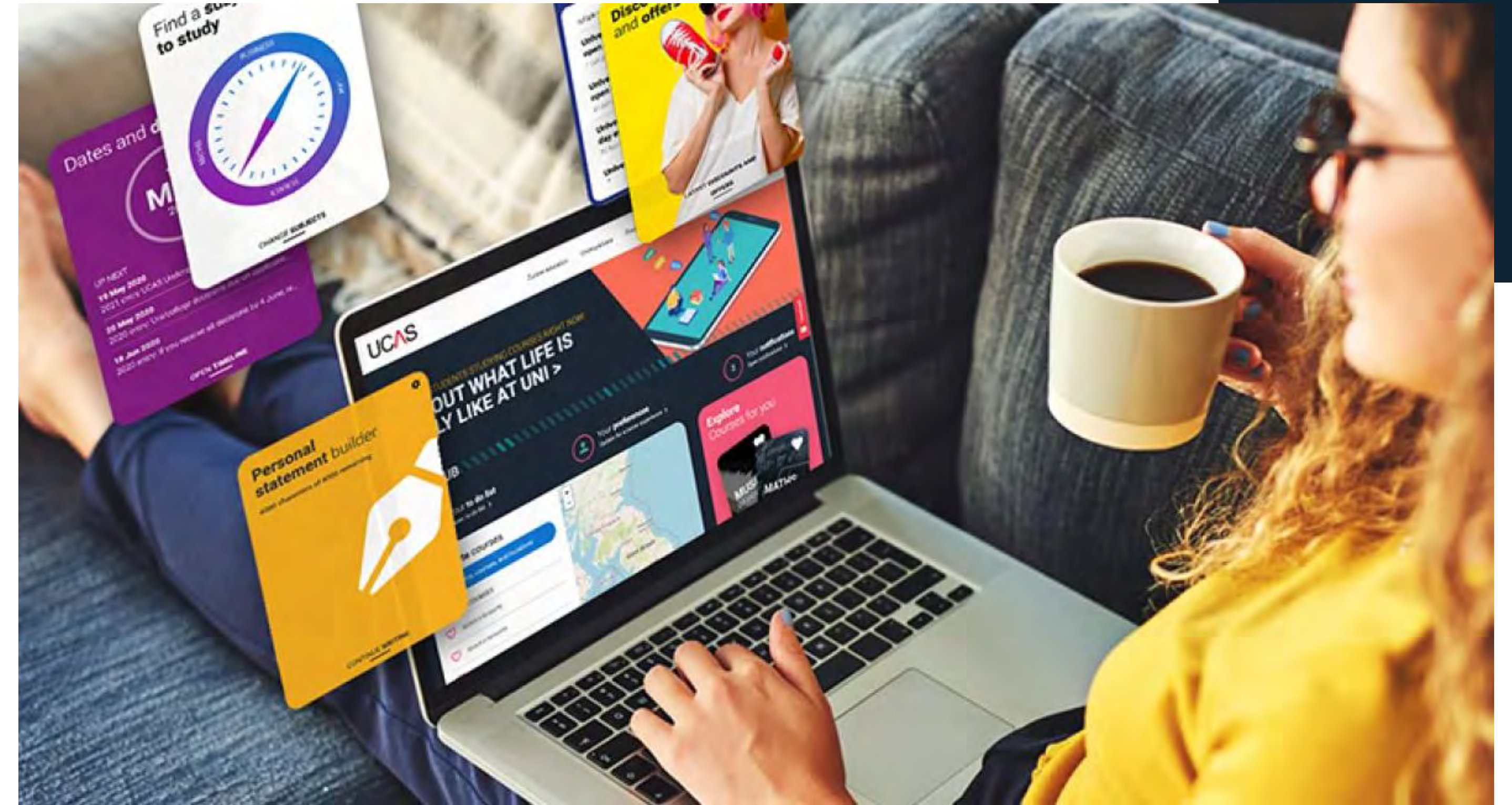

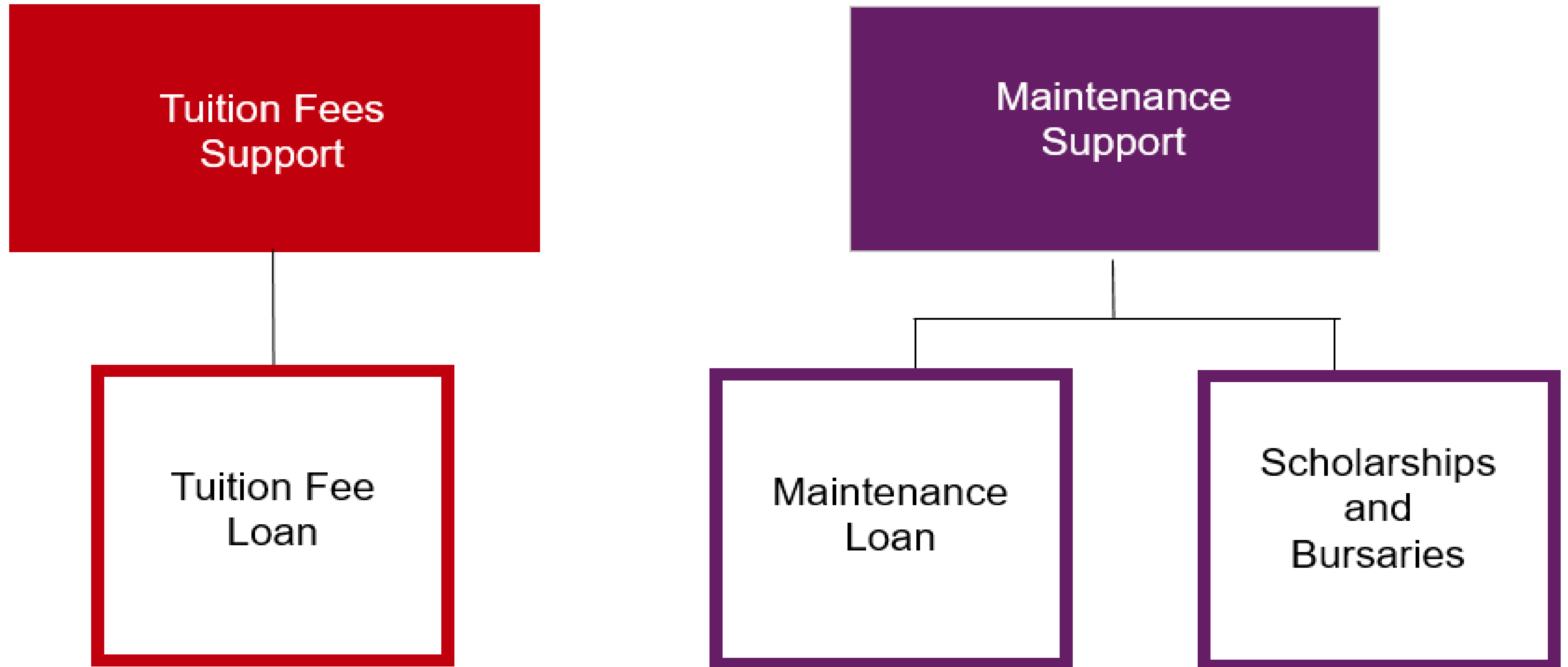

What is student finance?



Tuition fee loan

- Typically covers the full cost of the university tuition fees – maximum of £10,050 if you're studying at an eligible university from 2027
- The fee is paid directly to the university in three instalments during the academic year.

Maintenance costs – the cost of living

- This covers the essentials such as food, rent and study resources.
- A maintenance loan is available to all UK students on a full-time undergraduate course
- It is paid directly to the student in three instalments
- The amount you get depends on two factors:
 - Your household income
 - Where you study

Maintenance loans and grants

- Applicants with a household income below £25,000 will receive the maximum available including a maintenance grant of £4,355 (non-repayable)
- Parents and guardians will provide details of the applicant's household income which will be verified by HMRC using National Insurance numbers
- Further evidence may be required
- If your household income is over a current level (£42,875 for 2025 entry) students will not be able to get a maintenance grant
