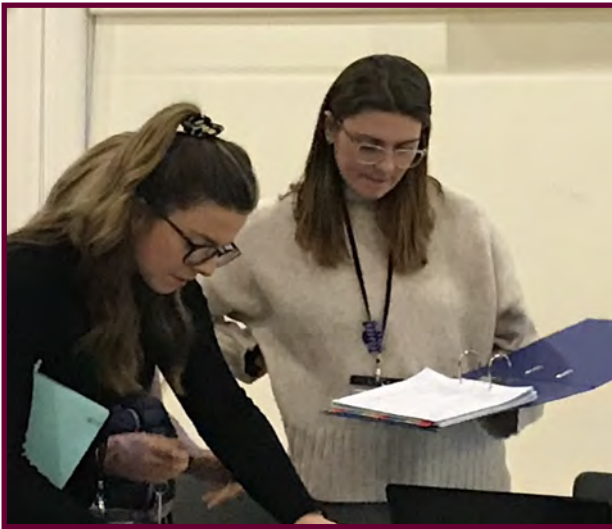

Election 2019 Husting

The Blandford School Sixth Form welcomed candidates from the four parties standing in the North Dorset constituency for an Election 2019 Husting. Simon Hoare (Conservatives), Pat Osborne (Labour), David Chadwick (Liberal Democrats) and Ken Huggins (Green Party) answered questions submitted by students on a range of issues:

What policies do you have, both immediately and in the long term, to tackle climate change?

What are your parties' policies to address the amount of plastic-choking fragile environments?

Do you think that another referendum on Brexit would be democratic?

What are your parties' intentions regarding tuition fees and student loans (and the funding needed)?

What would your government do to improve transport links in Dorset?

All students in Years 12 and 13, some of whom were eligible to vote on December 12th, took part in the husting, listening to all responses and offering opinions of their own. The event, chaired by Assistant Head of Sixth Form Jason Langford, was designed to engage young people in the democratic process and provide inspiration for a Mock Election that took place on 12th December. The election was led by Sixth Form students, some of whom stood as candidates, whilst others will played a role in campaign teams and in organising voting on "polling day".

The Final results was;

**1st Place – Sidney J, Liberal Democrats
(31%)**

**2nd Place – Joseph S, Conservatives
(25%)**

3rd Place – Nathan S, Labour (22%)

4th Place – Louie D, Green (20%)

**The "turnout" was approximately 60%,
similar to the General Election.**

The national slogan for this year's anti-bullying week was, 'Change starts with us.' We were exceedingly proud of our own growing anti-bullying team who had both the insight and the courage to ask to independently write (and very confidently present) their own assembly around this message, to mark the event in 2019. It is true that every single one of us, students, staff and families, can continue to strive to make a

difference in this area.

Most importantly, students from all year groups (7-11) all worked collaboratively and were all represented in the year assemblies during the week. Their message was both important and powerful. Not only did they represent the whole student body but they also made specific reference to our agreed desire to include all groups, for example the LGBTQ+.

The team looked more closely at the definition of bullying which is not just 'falling out with friends' but involves a persistent intent to humiliate. They also explained 'banter' and where this is just a part of life where everyone is in on the joke and where it can descend into bullying. They also explained the different types of bullying and the significant national statistics.

Whilst we always mark the national anti-bullying week, we are clear that the message needs to be heard and enforced the whole year long. We are so grateful to our colleagues from the local Victim Support Team and also Treads of Blandford who provide detailed and comprehensive after school training sessions and ongoing training. We have also participated in the national Diana Anti-Bullying Award Scheme.

Library Fundraising

We have had two successful fundraising events for our school library recently. The Book Fair, organised by Mrs Norris and her team of sixth-formers, sold £387 of books. This means we have been allowed to purchase more than £190 of books from the same company for our library. Most importantly, there was a real buzz in the library as students pored over the books on offer. Thank you for supporting this event.

On Friday, 6th December, Rebekah's Kitchen hosted a 'Cocktails and Canapes' evening to raise funds. This very popular event raised £451.50 for our library fund! Sincere thanks to Laura and Dan for their generosity in donating the profits from the evening's festivities.

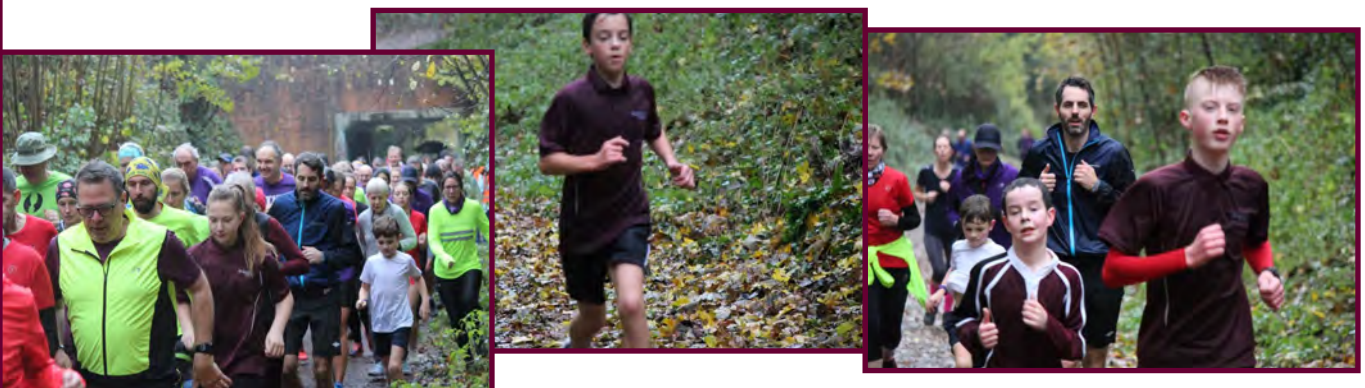
And finally.....we are excited to be looking forward to taking squads from Y8 and 9 to PGL Liddington on the 20th March.
