## The Blandford School - Careers Education Programme

The Blandford School is committed to delivering high quality Careers Education for all students which meets the Gatsby Benchmarks for careers advice.

- 1. A stable careers programme
- 2. Learning from career and labour market information
- 3. Addressing the needs of each pupil
- 4. Linking curriculum learning to careers
- 5. Encounters with employers and employees
- 6. Experiences of workplaces
- 7. Encounters with further and higher education

The schools named careers leader is Paul Gilson (Careers Leader and Teacher of Science) who works with Vicky Moore (Assistant Headteacher, Head of Sixth Form) to ensure the needs of students are met. Stevie Joanne McCormick works alongside the careers leader providing Impartial Advice and Guidance.

Students are able to refer themselves for individual Careers Advice Appointments or may be referred by school staff, students wishing to have an appointment should speak to their tutor initially.

The school also works with the Careers and Enterprise Company and its Enterprise Advisor to deliver careers advice and guidance and allows providers of technical education access to the school to inform students regarding the progression routes they offer. - 2. References to careers and employment in lessons and the engagement of guest speakers

- 8. Displays relating to careers education and apprenticeship opportunities
